MINNESOTA INCIDENT **COMMAND SYSTEM** (MNICS)



MNICS is an interagency group with state and federal partners that cooperate to manage wildfire and all-risk incidents. MNICS provides standard procedures and common terminology to support emergency response. A Task Force of agency leaders governs the organization.

Member agencies include the U.S. Forest Service (USFS); Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA); Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR); U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS); National Park Service (NPS); and the Minnesota Department of Public Safety (DPS), Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM).

The mission of MNICS is to coordinate, educate and implement the Incident Command System to support fire and all-risk incidents in Minnesota and nationwide.

Minnesota Wildfire Academy is offering a week-long, tuition-free, incident management team (IMT) course designed for trainees or those needed recertification to work directly with Academy IMT mentors.

S-130 S-190 L-180

Basic Wildland Firefighter, Introduction to Fire Behavior, and Human Factors on the Fireline

Mon, June 5, 0800 - Fri, June 9, 1700

S-130 introduces basic firefighting skills. S-190 covers primary factors that affect wildland fire behavior, the start and spread of a wildfire, recognizing the risks and potentially hazardous situations to firefighters. L-180 exposes students to human performance concepts as part of the basic wildland firefighter training. Prerequisites: ICS-100 and IS-700 NIMS (online)

S-131

Firefighter Type 1

Session 1: Mon, June 5, 1200 – Tues, June 6, 1700 Session 2: Wed, June 7, 1200 – Thurs, June 8, 1700

NOTE: The course is offered at two separate times during the Academy. Sign up for only one session.

This course is required for the advanced firefighter or squad boss (FFT1) and the Type 5 incident commander (ICT5). The interactive tactical exercises encourage fireline reference and documentation materials, communication, LCES, and tactical decision-making discussions.

Prerequisites: Qualified as Firefighter Type 2 (FFT2) **Bring:** Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG)

S-200

Initial Attack Incident Commander

Mon, June 5, 0800 - Tues, June 6, 1700

This training course is intended for the initial attack incident commander (ICT4). It is presented in a lecture, discussion, and group exercise format. The course covers foundation skills, intelligence gathering and documentation, size up the incident, develop a plan of action plan, post-fire activities, evaluate incident objectives and manage the incident.

Prerequisites: Qualified as any single resource boss (CRWB, ENGB, FIRB), successful completion of pre-coursework

S-211

Portable Pumps and Water Use

Wed, June 7, 0800 - Fri, June 9, 1700

Provides knowledge and skills development to design, set up, operate, troubleshoot, and shut down portable water delivery systems. Focus is on portable pumps and not water delivery for engines. Topics will include equipment, roles and responsibilities, system design and hydraulics. Includes a field exercise.

S-212 Wildland Fire Chainsaws (Faller)

Mon, June 5, 0800 – Thurs, June 8, 1700

An introduction to the function, maintenance, use, and tactical wildland fire application of internal combustion engine powered chain saws. Classroom and field exercises focus on cutting techniques and procedures applicable throughout the U.S. and addresses local tree and brush species differences.

Prerequisites: Qualified as FFT2 Class size: 30 Course Fee: \$460.00

S-215

Fire Operations in the Wildland/Urban Interface

Session 1: Mon, June 5, 0800 – Wed, June 7, 1700 Session 2: Thurs, June 8, 0800 - Sat, June 10, 1700

NOTE: The course is offered at two separate times during the Academy. Session 2 is open to structure and local fire departments only. Sign up for only one session.

Covers tactical decision making when confronting wildland fires that threaten life and property. Provides overview of action plan improvements, structural triage, structural protections tactics, incident action plan assessment and update, followup and public relations, and firefighter safety in the interface.

Prerequisites: Students must be qualified as Advanced Firefighter (FFT1). For structural fire departments, the S-215 course is appropriate for engine operators, chief officers, and company officers responsible for structure protection in suburban and urban interface areas.

S-219

Firing Operations

Tues, June 6, 0800 - Thurs, June 8, 1200

This entry-level course focuses on functional roles and responsibilities for firing operations. The course covers planning, ignition procedures and techniques, and equipment for wildland and prescribed fire.

Prerequisite: Qualified as FFT2

Bring: IRPG

Class size: 30 Course fee: \$345.00

S-230

Crew Boss (Single Resource)

Mon, June 5, 0800 - Wed, June 7, 1700

This course focuses on single resource crew boss performance and responsibilities from the initial dispatch through demobilization and back to the home unit. Topics include preparation for mobilization and the assignment, tactics and safety, off-line duties, and demobilization and post-incident activities.

Prerequisites: Students must be qualified as FFT1, and successfully completed Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior (S-290).

Pre-Work: Complete and bring to the first day of class the 21-question assignment using the IRPG.

S-231

Engine Boss (Single Resource)

Thurs, June 8, 0800 - Fri, June 9, 1700

This skills-based course is designed to produce student proficiency in performing the duties associated with Engine Boss, Single Resource (ENGB). Topics include engine and crew capabilities and limitations, information sources, fire size-up considerations, tactics, and the wildland/urban interface.

Prerequisites: Qualified as FFT1, completion of S-230, Crew Boss (Single Resource) (CRWB)

Bring: IRPG

Class size: 30 Course Fee: \$275.00

S-261

Applied Interagency Incident Business Management

Mon, June 5, 0800 – Wed, June 7, 1200

This course is designed for entry-level finance positions. Students will work directly from the **NWCG Standards for Interagency Incident Business** Management, PMS 902 for most of the exercises.

Prerequisite: Interagency Incident Business

Management (S-260)

S-270

Basic Air Operations

Session 1: Mon, June 5, 0800 – Tues, June 6, 1700 Session 2: Wed, June 7, 0800 – Thurs, June 8, 1700

NOTE: The course is offered at two separate times during the Academy. Sign up for only one session.

Course covers the variety of aircraft used in wildland firefighting, capabilities of aviation management, and safety for flying in and working with agency aircraft.

Topics focus on management policy, aircraft operations regulations, tactical and logistical uses, and the specifications for helicopter landing areas.

Prerequisite: None

Class Size: 35 Course Fee: \$275.00

S-290

Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior

Mon, June 5, 0800 - Thurs, June 8, 1700

This is a classroom-based skills course designed to prepare the prospective fireline supervisor to undertake safe and effective fire management operations. It is the second course in a series that collectively serves to develop fire behavior prediction knowledge and skills. Fire environment differences are discussed as necessary.

Prerequisite: Introduction to Fire Behavior (S-190).

Pre-Work: Complete the course pre-test

Bring: PMS-210 and IRPG

Class size: 30 Course Fee: \$525.00



EVOC

Emergency Vehicle Operations

Session 1: Mon, June 5, 0800 – 1700 Session 2: Thurs, June 8, 0800 - 1700

NOTE: The course is offered at two separate times during the Academy. Sign up for only one session.

The Emergency Vehicle Operations (EVOC) course is required for anyone who operates a vehicle with red lights and a siren. The course includes classroom and driving coursework. The topics focus on driver performance, differences between personal and emergency vehicles, maintenance, operation, emergency response, safety, Minnesota laws and agency policies governing emergency vehicle operation.

Prerequisites: Students must hold a valid Minnesota driver's license (Class commensurate with the size of engine the student is expected to drive). Students must bring an engine they operate in their regular work environment (no larger than a T-5). Multiple students from the same unit only need to bring one engine.

Class size: 30 Course Fee: \$145.00

L-280 Followership to Leadership

Mon, June 5, 0800 - Tues, June 6, 1700

The classroom instruction and field experience in the course will prepare individuals seeking to step up into a leadership role. Students will work through a series of problem-solving situations focusing on leadership values and principles, team cohesion, ethical decision-making, and after-action review (AAR) techniques. Some of the course delivery may be arduous in nature.

Prerequisites: Completion of the L-180 course, pre-coursework, and experience as an operations or support function on incident assignments.

ICS 300

Intermediate Incident Command System for **Expanding Incidents**

Mon, June 5, 0800 - Wed, June 7, 1700

ICS-300 provides training and resources for personnel who require advanced knowledge and application of the Incident Command System (ICS). The course expands on foundational information covered in the ICS-100 and ICS-200 courses. It is intended for individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents or support Type 3 incidents. This course is National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliant.

Prerequisites: ICS-100, ICS-200, ICS-700, ICS-800

RT-130 Wildland Fire Annual Safety Refresher

Fri, June 9, 0800 - 1700

The RT-130 is a required course providing up to date fireline safety information for all employees holding Incident Command System (ICS) qualifications.

FI-110

Wildland Fire Observations & Origin Scene Protection for First Responders

Fri, June 9, 0800 - 1700

The primary emphasis of this course is to teach sound wildland fire observations and origin scene protection practices, preparing first responders to a wildland fire scene on how to perform proper origin scene protection procedures.

Prerequisites: None
