

# MINNESOTA INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM (MNICS)



MNICS is an interagency group with state and federal partners that cooperate to manage wildfire and all-risk incidents. MNICS provides standard procedures and common terminology to support emergency response. A Task Force of agency leads governs the organization.

Member agencies include the U.S. Forest Service (USFS), Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR), U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS), National Park Service (NPS), and the Minnesota Department of Public Safety's Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM).

The mission of MNICS is to coordinate, educate, and implement the Incident Command System to support fire and all-risk incidents in Minnesota and nationwide.

#### S-130 S-190 L-180

#### Basic Wildland Firefighter, Introduction to Fire Behavior, and Human Factors on the Fireline

#### Mon, June 3, 0800 – Fri, June 7, 1700

S-130 introduces basic firefighting skills. S-190 covers primary factors that affect wildland fire behavior, the start and spread of a wildfire, recognizing the risks and potentially hazardous situations to firefighters. L-180 exposes students to human performance concepts as part of the basic wildland firefighter training.

Prerequisites: ICS-100 and IS-700 NIMS (online)Class size: 80Course Fee: \$600.00



#### **S-131** *Firefighter Type 1*

Session 1: Mon, June 3, 0800 – Tues, June 4, 1700 Session 2: Wed, June 5, 0800 – Thurs, June 6, 1700 NOTE: The course is offered at two separate times during the Academy. Sign up for only one session.

This course is a requirement for the advanced firefighter or squad boss (FFT1) and the Type 5 incident commander (ICT5). The interactive, tactical exercises focus on the fireline reference and documentation materials, communication, LCES, and tactical decision-making discussions.

**Prerequisites:** Firefighter Type 2 (FFT2) qualified **Bring:** Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG) **Class size:** 30 **Course Fee:** \$250.00

#### S-200

#### Initial Attack Incident Commander

Session 1: Mon, June 3, 0800 – Tues, June 4, 1700 Session 2: Wed, June 5, 0800 – Thurs, June 6, 1700 Note: The course is offered at two separate times during the Academy. Sign up for only one session.

Intended for the initial attack incident commander (ICT4), this course focuses on the foundational skills necessary to gather incident intelligence and documentation, size-up the incident, develop a plan of action plan (including post-fire activities), and evaluate the incident objectives to manage an incident.

**Prerequisites:** Qualified as any single resource boss (CRWB, ENGB, FIRB), successful completion of pre-coursework

**Bring:** Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG) and Wildland Fire Incident Management Guide **Class size:** 30 **Course Fee:** \$320.00



#### **S-211** Portable Pumps and Water Use

#### Wed, June 5, 0800 – Fri, June 7, 1700

Provides knowledge and skills development to design, set up, operate, troubleshoot, and shut down portable water delivery systems. Focus is on portable pumps and not water delivery for engines. Topics will include equipment, roles and responsibilities, system design and hydraulics. Includes a field exercise.

Bring: Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG) Class size: 30 Course Fee: \$380.00

#### S-212

#### Wildland Fire Chainsaws (Faller)

#### Mon, June 3, 0800 – Thurs, June 6, 1700

An introduction to the function, maintenance, use, and tactical wildland fire application of internal combustion engine powered chain saws. Classroom and field exercises focus on cutting techniques and procedures applicable throughout the U.S. and addresses local tree and brush species differences

Prerequisites: Qualified as FFT2Class size: 30Course Fee: \$450.00

#### S-215

Fire Operations in the Wildland/Urban Interface Mon, June 3, 0800 – Thurs, June 6, 1200 Note: Thursday is the course field day

Instructional units include firefighter safety and managing human factors in the interface, preincident planning, size up and initial strategy, a structure protection overview and structure triage, tactics and tactical operations and resource use in the interface, action assessment, plan update, and the after-action review.

**Prerequisites:** Wildland fire students must be Advanced Firefighter (FFT1) qualified. The S-215 course is also appropriate for structural fire department engine operators, chief officers, and company officers responsible for structure protection in suburban and urban interface areas.

**Class size:** 24 **Course fee:** \$350.00



#### S-219

#### **Firing Operations**

#### Tues, June 4, 0800 – Thurs, June 6, 1200

An entry-level course focused on the functional roles and responsibilities for firing operations. The course covers planning, ignition procedures and techniques, and equipment for wildland and prescribed fire.

**Prerequisite:** Qualified as FFT2

Bring: Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG) Class size: 30 Course fee: \$340.00

#### S-230

#### Crew Boss (Single Resource)

Mon, June 3, 0800 – Wed, June 5, 1700

This course focuses on performing single resource crew boss responsibilities, from the initial dispatch through to the demobilization, and return to the home unit. Topics include preparation for mobilization and the assignment, tactics and safety, off-line duties, and the demobilization and post-incident activities.

**Prerequisites:** FFT1 qualified, Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior (S-290).

**Pre-Work:** Complete a 21-question assignment using the IRPG - *due first day of class*.

Bring: Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG) Class size: 30 Course Fee: \$360.00

#### S-231 Engine Boss (Single Resource) Thurs, June 6, 0800 – Fri, June 7, 1700

This skills-based course is designed to improve proficiency when performing duties associated with the Engine Boss, Single Resource (ENGB) qualification. The topics include engine and crew capabilities and limitations, information sources, fire size-up considerations, tactics, and wildland/urban interface.

Prerequisites: Qualified as FFT1, completion of S-230, Crew Boss (Single Resource) (CRWB) Bring: Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG) Class size: 30 Course Fee: \$350.00

#### S-236

#### Heavy Equipment Boss (Single Resource) Wed., June 5, 0800 – Fri, June 7, 1200

Course content is designed to produce student proficiency in performing the duties associated with Heavy Equipment Boss, Single Resource (HEQB). Topics include tactics and safety precautions required to establish and maintain an effective dozer operation.

**Prerequisite:** Qualified as FFT1, Completion of S-230, Completion of course pre-work.

**Class size:** 24 **Course Fee:** \$320.00





### S-270

#### Basic Air Operations

#### Wed, June 5, 0800 – Thurs, June 6, 1700

This course covers the variety of aircraft used in wildland firefighting, capabilities of aviation management, and safety for flying in and working with agency aircraft.

The topics will focus on management policy, aircraft operation regulations, tactical and logistical uses, and the specifications for helicopter landing areas.

Prerequisite: None Class Size: 35 Course Fee: \$240.00

#### S-290

#### Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior

#### Mon, June 3, 0800 – Thurs, June 6, 1700

The S-290 course provides classroom-based instruction designed to prepare the prospective fireline supervisor to undertake safe and effective fire management operations. It is the second course in a series that collectively serves to develop fire behavior prediction knowledge and skills. The fire environment differences are also discussed as appropriate to the topic.

**Prerequisite:** Intro. to Fire Behavior (S-190). **Pre-Work:** Complete the course pre-test.

Bring: PMS-210 and Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG)

**Class size:** 30 **Course Fee:** \$520.00

#### L-280 Followership to Leadership

#### Mon, June 3, 0800 – Tues, June 4, 1700

The course is designed to prepare individuals looking to step into a leadership role. Through classroom instruction and field experiences, students will work through a series of problem-solving scenarios applying practical leadership values and principles, team cohesion, ethical decision-making, and afteraction review (AAR) techniques. Some of the course delivery may be arduous in nature.

**Prerequisites:** L-180 Human Factors on the Fireline, pre-coursework, and experience on incident assignments in operations or a support function.

**Class Size:** 24 **Course Fee:** \$300.00



#### **ICS 300**

#### *Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents* Mon, June 3, 0800 – Wed, June 5, 1700

ICS-300 provides advanced training and resources on the application of the Incident Command System (ICS). The course expands on the foundational information covered in the ICS-100 and 200 level courses. It is intended for individuals who may assume a supervisory role during an expanding incident or Type 3 incidents. This is a National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliant course.

Prerequisites: ICS - 100, 200 and IS- 700 and 800 (all available online) Class size: 25 Course Fee: \$430.00



#### ICS-400 Advanced ICS – Complex Incidents

Thurs, June 6, 0800 – Fri, June 7, 1700

ICS-400 provides training and resources for personnel who require advanced knowledge and application of the Incident Command System (ICS). The course expands on foundational information covered in ICS-300. It is intended for individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents or support Type 3 incidents. This is a National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliant course.

Prerequisites: ICS-100, ICS-200, IS-700 and 800(all available online), and completion of ICS-300Class Size: 25Course Fee: \$220.00

#### **FI-110** Wildland Fire Observations & Origin Scene Protection for First Responders

#### Fri, June 7, 0800 – 1700

The primary focus of this course is sound wildland fire observations and origin scene protection practices, best practices for first responders to a wildland fire scene to perform proper origin scene protection procedures.

Prerequisites: None

**Class Size:** 30 **Course Fee:** \$155.00



#### RT-130

#### Wildland Fire Annual Safety Refresher Fri, June 7, 0800 – 1700

The RT-130 is a required course providing up to date fireline safety information for all employees who hold Incident Command System (ICS) qualifications.

Prerequisites: None Class Size: 20 Course Fee: \$150.00
